Investing in Student Success

Created in 1999, the Rising Star Program provides incentive and encouragement for high school students to stay in school, graduate and continue on to college.

Rising Star awards up to \$4,000 in tuition and books at any of the seven Dallas County Community Colleges to eligible Dallas County high school seniors who graduate with a "B" average or better and demonstrate economic need.

This supports approximately 60% of expenses to earn an associate degree.

Through the Rising Star Program, students can:

- + Earn associate degrees.
- + Become certified in one of over 100 career programs offered at the colleges of DCCCD.
- **+** Earn college credit to transfer to a four-year college.

Providing Personalized Support and Removing Financial Barriers



Recipients succeed through personalized support offered by the Rising Star offices at each of the seven DCCCD colleges.



The seven colleges of DCCCD provide recruiting, marketing and case management of Rising Star students to increase their chances of successful completion or transfer to a university.



Rising Star serves as a "funder of last resort" to students in financial need. Students must first apply for federal financial aid before Rising Star compensates with funds to help cover the cost of college.




Leading the Way






SNAPSHOT 2015-2016 RISING STAR STUDENTS

Rising Star students outperform retention and completion rates among community colleges each year.












Ethnicity




Dallas County (2014 Estimate)*


