

Many of your fellow citizens of Dallas County joined together to create the DCCCD Rising Star Scholarship.

Created in 1999, Rising Star provides a promise to local graduating high school students:

If you finish high school with a B average or better and have unmet financial need.

Then you are guaranteed the opportunity to earn a college education at a DCCCD college.

Rising Star has provided over 14,500 students with funds for tuition and books.

But what about adults, those who didn't enter college right after high school? Or those who relocated to Dallas County to find a job? With your help, we're ready to expand our promise to our community.

INTRODUCING LEVELUP

A promise to adult students in Dallas County.





DCCCD is ready to expand the promise made through Rising Star.

LevelUp is a new scholarship open to all Dallas County residents who are 21 years and older that demonstrate financial need.

Like Rising Star, LevelUp provides last-dollar funding for tuition and book costs that aren't covered by Pell grants or other financial aid.

Each participant will be matched with a community mentor who will help them throughout their DCCCD journey.

Students will enroll in fast-track, highdemand Promise Pathway programs determined annually based on labor market demands.

Veterans will receive priority.

LevelUp will inspire individuals to achieve while helping businesses prosper at the same time.




CASH & PLEDGES

Our students reflect the rich diversity of Dallas County.
















165K STUDENTS EACH YEAR

EXPANDING THE PROMISE



Rising Star

In 1999, the education outlook in Dallas County was bleak, at best. More than 40% of all ninth graders within Dallas ISD were dropping out of high school before graduating. Dallas had the second highest dropout rate in the nation.

Created that same year, the Rising Star scholarship program provides up to \$4,000 in tuition and books to Dallas County high school seniors who graduate with a "B" average or better and demonstrate economic need.

Participants also receive ongoing academic counseling and support services through Rising Star offices at each DCCCD college. Students can choose an associate degree, university transfer degree or become certified in a professional skill.

To date, 14,500 students have participated in Rising Star
